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Hello everyone!

I posted a handful of times or more to the old message board. I know I am one of two named Anna. Last time I was at the old message board the other Anna was pregnant...I hope she is doing well.

I am 40 yrs old. I will be 41 in September. I have one adult son who is 18 1/2 yrs old. Even though

he was lost to open adoption, I remained a part of his life growing up and still have contact now, but not very often. He is now very busy with his own life, going to college, working and his friends and he lives in San Diego (my hometown) 350 miles away.

At the time I had my son, my abusive ex b/f (and father of my son) forced me to have a tubal ligation at the age of 22. It took me 17 1/2 years to have the money to be able to have the tubal reversal surgery. So, last August 10, 2004 at the age of 39 yrs and 10 1/2 months. I had the reversal done. We are now in our 13th cycle of TTC since the tubal reversal. I had labs done in March and I had a CD3 FSH of 4.9 (which is excellent) so at least we know that I have a good egg reserve, but quantity does not equal quality, so I hope I have some good ones left. I had an HSG done in May to make sure my tubes had remained open. My longer 8cm left tube is wide open and healthy. My very short 4cm right tube is only barely open and is enlarged at the end. This is my first cycle of Clomid and it did work and I know for sure that I ovulated on the 4th of July. I am now in the 2ww and have been prayful that this will be our month.

I just found out 2 weeks ago that my 41 yr old (will be 42 in Nov) first cousin is now pregnant and due in Jan/Feb 2006. I have a strong genetic factor in my favor. Most of the women in my family have had babies into their 40's, but it has yet to help me!

I have been married for 8 1/2 yrs. My DH Sean is 34 (35 in Oct). I have a 15 1/2 yr old stepson, Ryan, who I am close to. He comes for the summer and the holidays and actually will be here in a few weeks for his annual summer visit. Sadly, I think this will be his last long summer visit with us. Since next summer he will be 16 and will have a job and car and I just don't see him coming up to visit. So, I'm very happy that he is coming this summer.

My DH and I are open to God blessing us with as many children as I can have in my 40's. Although, I would count myself blessed to be able to have at least one, we really would like to have more than one, but I've yet to be able to become pregnant. I have had no m/c's, no ectopics, no chemical pregnancies, nothing, just nothing at all.

This whole TTC for the past 11 months has put a stress on my marriage. I am a believer, my DH is not. After 13 cycles of trying my DH is really tired of waiting (as am I) and has basically given up hope that it will ever happen, but I turn to prayer...that is not to say that I have not been angry at times with God in the last year. But this month I am hopeful that God will breathe life into my barren womb.

No, I wasn't able to breastfeed the twins and I really felt awful about it for awhile. They told me that because they came at 36 weeks, the babies weren't able to suck as well as if they'd come later on. Much farther down the road, I realized that I wasn't making enough milk after I delivered either. I believe this was due to the great amount of fluid I retained towards the end of the pregnancy, and also the extra blood loss from delivering twins. I suppose in the end though, it

was easier to formula feed them so I could have help. But, I did miss that specialness that comes from nursing babies.

You already know Tammi? Wonderful! I met her on CHFWeb and have nothing but admiration for her. She's been having problems with AOL and that might also be why you haven't heard from her as much. I'm 43, and in peri-menopause; have been told that while I can get pregnant again, it's highly unlikely. I get a little cheapo test once in awhile just to check, because my cycles have been so messed up, I never know, and am on anti-depression/anxiety meds, etc. Just took a test a little over a week ago, perhaps 2 weeks ago, and it was negative. Went to the grocery store last night, thought I'd get one just for grins. Been gaining weight for no reason, tired, but that's not unusual, and no other symptoms, so expected the usual negative. Well, that extra little line showed up! I took it to my husband, "Dad, uhm..." He was distracted. "DAD, UHM..." He looked at it...and, shall we say, "He Laughed"! LOL! I sent him back to the store for another test, he brought a 2 pack, just in case. Took snother test, there's that line again! Oh, boy! May test once more tomorrow just to make sure! Hah!

So, I've been fighting off a cold with some immunity boosting stuff, but decided I'd better not take anything now. It's 4:30 am, and I'm in here because I was coughing, keeping myself and my husband awake, decided to get up for some warm lemon/honey water and try to clear up this cough. Thought I'd check in here again. Last time I was here was just months after my miscarriage that happened 2 years ago!

Haven't told our daughters yet; they're 4 and 6. They'll be sooooo excited! My 6 year old has been saying for some time that she wants a baby brother! We started foster parenting classes again (took them when trying to get pregnant with her), but decided that we needed to concentrate on our own children for the time being, so didn't finish them. Well, she may get that baby brother yet! Though, knowing my body, it'll be another baby sister!

This is so weird! My body is getting old...I go to my dr. regularly for old people stuff...high cholesterol, just had a stress test and holter monitor for 24 hours (all is fine, just checking some past palpitations), stress, anxiety, need to lose about 50 lbs, my dr. was about to get me on cholesterol lowering meds...now I'm pregnant again! It honestly hasn't sunk in yet! Really did not expect this again; in fact, on the way home from the store last night, we saw a gal with her covered carseat/carrier on her basket going to her car, and I mentioned, "aren't you glad we don't have to do that anymore?" Then, # 2 came along in '02. We were complete! SURPRISE...another pregnancy in fall '04, but miscarried at 12 1/2 wks in Dec. Was told chromosomal, probably due to my age (41). My friend recently sent me this site as she thought it would be an encouragement to see that I'm not the only 40 something who is expecting. My Husband Andy and I have been married for almost 18 years and we have 3 daughters (almost 15, 9 and 6). We have had some struggles in maintaining pregnancies in the past. Pregnancy 1, 3, 4, 5 & 6 we lost. The latter 3 were believed to be low progesterone for sure. By the time we had our 7th pregnancy (age 32) I went on a progesterone supplement and we were blessed with a baby again. Then nearly three years later we were blessed again with our 3 child (8th pregnancy). Though we have believed we're done, there was nothing permanent to concrete this and my husband had made a habit of saying "when we have #4.....". Anyways, I've not entertained the thought though I always loved seeing little babies and such. It just seemed that we were done and of course we had purged our home of all baby things. By the end of June I was suspecting pregnancy. A pregnancy test showed a faint line and followed by blood work the next day. I started progesterone about 4 days later and today is 13 weeks with a due date of March 3rd, 2008. Just past 9 weeks I started having spotting and some cramping, and I prepared for the worst but thankfully a sonogram showed that the baby was in tact, strong heart beat but I do have a low lying placenta which is just overlapping the cervix. This pregnancy has changed our lives already and we've done a lot of soul searching in regards of WHO it is should be in control of the womb which is another chapter. We are excited though it did take me about 2 weeks to pick my jaw up off of the floor. 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Hello Ladies,

I am 46, and sit here writing this intro, with a wonderfully swollen belly full of life! Knowing now, that I am not alone!

It has made my heart sing with Joy and thanksgiving to find out there are other women out there who devote their time and energy on making a home and family to the Glory of God.

I have two grown children, who both have children, and my oldest, born in 1979 with spina bifida, died at the age of 25, of cancer. My second born, now 25, and his two children, 4 and 3 are living with us, and my youngest 23 just had her first born, after losing 2, her baby is 7 weeks old and I am due anytime in the next few weeks.

In 1985, after two miscarriages within 3 months and highly stressful living conditions, we were traveling the country with my husband's work as a contractor and living in motel rooms. I had all three kids still in diapers, and my oldest walking with leg braces and a walker. My youngest was 1 year old. My second was 3 and still not potty trained, and my oldest would always be in diapers. My husband was working a 12 hour overnight shift and slept all day (in a motel suite, with 3 kids) I had a complete nervous breakdown and in rebellion and defiance against God, I had my tubes tied. By one year later I already regretted it and the nightmare of symptoms began. I experienced 21 years of cysts, tubal pregnancy's, heavy bleeding, horrendous clots, and unimaginable pain, in my body, heart and soul.

In Jan of 1989 I rededicated my life and heart back to the Lord and sought forgiveness and healing. In 2007, 21 years and the same month, after I had my tubes tied, I am due to have the babies God showed me I would have, in a dream. In the dream I said it would be a boy and a girl, but the girl first, then the boy. Exactly one year later, my 7 year old son (now 25) had a dream of me having two babies and he said the exact same words, from my dream when he told me about his dream. I took it as confirmation, and rejoiced in the faithfulness of God to fulfill His promise. It has been a long road with many setbacks and disappointments and discouragements. God has faithfully chastened and uplifted me as needed, and shown me that disappointment was from having my confidence in "man" rather than in HIM!

When my son and his two toddlers moved in with us, sept of 06, I was so busy taking care of them, I put having a baby out of my mind. That was the last month of nightmare monthly cycles. I began having very light, completely painless cycles that were as much as 6 weeks apart, where they had been 3 weeks apart. I was sure I was going into menopause and when they stopped altogether I resigned to the idea that I was done having children.

I spent 3 months feeling sick and exhausted, and my instinct (heart) was telling me I was pregnant, but my brain kept saying no-way, it's just all part of menopause. Then at four months the nausea subsided and I began feeling movement. I blew off those early flutters as "gas", but they kept

getting bigger and stronger and one day I was sitting in the rocking chair my husband (of 27 years) bought me for nursing our "faith baby" many, many years ago, and my son had music playing and I noticed the movements were in sync with the music. This baby LOVES music and the sound of race cars on t.v. As the baby has gotten bigger the movements to music, always in rhythm, have become obviously dancing.

I have walked by total faith for the past 17 years, trusting all my cares upon Jesus, King of my heart. He has healed me and restored my strength after every miscarriage and even a ectopic pregnancy that went into the 6th month. You have to have faith to believe my testimony because there have been no doctors involved in my life or body for all of the past 17 years.

I am eagerly looking forward to and completely prepared and waiting to have my first home birth. I home schooled my previous 3 children and look forward with great excitement to homeschooling again, it was the best time of my life. Now I have experience and seeing my other two grown children living productive lives as both their mother and teacher, am very proud of them.

This, even as loooooooooong as it is , is my testimony in a "nutshell" I could write an entire book, and a sequel, of all that God has done in my life since my own birth.
